## APPLICATION GUIDELINES

In 2025, Hepatitis Queensland is offering World Hepatitis Day Local Grants of up to \$500 & \$1000, or a \$50 supermarket voucher to host a morning tea.

Hepatitis Queensland aims to support innovative activities that engage your communities in the fight to eliminate viral hepatitis by 2030. The campaign theme for 2025 is 'Defeat Hepatitis - Take Action Now'.

You know your community best. Hepatitis Queensland's World Hepatitis Day Grants allow us to support you within your local community to bring awareness around viral hepatitis and its impacts on individual health.

Do you have an idea for a project, activity, or event that supports eliminating viral hepatitis in your community? Then we want to hear from you!

### WHAT IS THE WHD LOCAL GRANTS PROGRAM?

The WHD Local Grants Program supports organisations in Queensland to implement community activities for World Hepatitis Day.

This program aims to:

- educate your community about liver health
- raise awareness of viral hepatitis prevention, and increase testing, treatment, vaccination and management
- reduce stigma and discrimination in the community
- provide support to people living with viral hepatitis
- increase awareness of our work at Hepatitis Queensland promote collaboration and partnerships between organisations

## **START** WHO CAN APPLY?

We encourage Government and non-Government organisations or groups operating in Queensland to apply.

We will give preference to proposals from groups or organisations who work:

- directly with people who are living with viral hepatitis
- with viral hepatitis priority populations, such as:
  - Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples
  - Culturally and linguistically diverse communities
  - people who inject drugs/history of injecting drug use
  - people experiencing homelessness
  - people in custodial settings people living in rural and remote areas.



## **HOW WILL WE KNOW IF WE'VE BEEN SUCCESSFUL?**

Hepatitis Queensland will let you know the outcome of your application by email no later than Monday, 19th May 2025. Please note that grant funds:

- Can only be paid to the bank account of the applicant organisation
- Will be paid once you have provided a Tax Invoice to Hepatitis Queensland - 14 462 175 789 for the agreed grant amount exclusive of GST
- Tax invoices must be emailed to Jo Coffey at [admin@hepqld.asn.au](mailto:admin@hepqld.asn.au) by Monday 19/05/2025
- Will be deposited by EFT

### **! Reporting Requirements**

Successful organisations will be required to complete a brief evaluation report and proof of activity. You will also be required to provide a short article that we will feature on Hepatitis Queensland's World Hepatitis Day webpage.

## **MENU** WHAT CAN BE FUNDED?

Eligible activities must have clear outcomes and no ongoing expenses. Some examples of eligible activities include:

- BBQ or catering for hep C awareness and point-of-care testing events
- Hepatitis B education and advocacy campaigns
- Lunch and learn sessions
- Community outreach events
- University open day stalls with awareness raising activities

The following will NOT be funded:

- wages and other employment costs
- ongoing running costs for projects that are already being implemented
- financial support for the individual
- activities conducted or delivered outside of Queensland.



## **HOW IS IT ASSESSED?**

Hepatitis Queensland will assess applications using the following criteria:

- Your activity contributes to one or more of the World Hepatitis Day Local Grants program aims
- You will deliver your activity close to or on World Hepatitis Day
- Your application clearly states the expected project outcomes
- Your application demonstrates how you will evaluate activities
- Your activity targets viral hepatitis priority populations
- Your activity promotes collaboration between relevant organisations

Hepatitis Queensland reserves the right to award, or not award, a grant at its sole discretion, and no further correspondence on an application will be considered.
